#### **Federal transportation financing in flux**

There is still considerable uncertainty surrounding the future of the federal fiscal year (FFY) 2007 transportation appropriations bill. An appropriations measure was initially to have passed last fall. Following the fall elections, Congress approved a continuing resolution (CR) that continues FFY 2007 funding at FFY 2006 levels through February 15, 2007. Congress is expected to approve another extension. Wisconsin was slated to receive federal funding for specific highway, transit and aviation projects in the appropriations bill through the earmarking process. Formula funding levels for highways, transit and aviation are also expected to be lower if approved at the FFY 2006 level. WisDOT is continuing to analyze potential impacts of the federal budgetary situation on Wisconsin and is keeping the state's Congressional delegation informed.

#### **Several state DOT's under new leadership**

Current WisDOT Secretary Frank Busalacchi is looking forward to continuing his service as head of the Wisconsin DOT. Meanwhile, several other state DOT's have announced new leaders for their transportation agencies including:

#### **Grace period over for booster seat law**

As of January 1, 2007, Wisconsin police officers can issue citations for violations of the recently-enacted child booster seat law. The law requires that children in vehicles be properly restrained in booster seats from age 4 until they reach age 8. When the measure first took effect last June, police officers could only issue warnings for a first violation. However, the "grace" period has ended, allowing officers to issue citations. Act 106 also makes it the driver's responsibility to ensure everyone, regardless of age, is buckled up in a vehicle. More information is available at:

### **Hiawatha sets annual ridership record**

More people rode Amtrak's Hiawatha Service between Milwaukee and Chicago last year than ever before. More than 588,000 people rode the rails during 2006, the most since the state of Wisconsin began supporting the service with Illinois in 1989. December also marked the 26th straight month in which ridership broke a record for that particular month, with more than 51,000 people taking the train. The Hiawatha Service provides up to 7 round trips daily between Milwaukee and Chicago

The U.S. Department of Transportation has approved the 2006 – 2008 Wisconsin Strategic Highway Safety Plan.
